SELECTION CRITERIA

1. An understanding of the current rules and regulations relating to Home Medication Reviews in Australia.
2. A competent level of clinical knowledge as it relates to common disease states and medications encountered during medication reviews.
3. A high-level of verbal communication and interpersonal skills including ability to liaise effectively with consumers, general practitioners, pharmacists and other health professionals.
4. Demonstrated competency in written communication skills.
5. Well-developed organisational skills including time management.
6. Demonstrated self-motivation and initiative.
7. The ability to be able to work as part of a team.
8. Registration as a pharmacist, with accreditation for Medication Management Reviews a considerable advantage, but not essential. If not accredited a willingness to become accredited prior to commencement of employment would be required.
9. Demonstrated working knowledge of Microsoft Office.
10. Current drivers license with access to a reliable vehicle.
